## Make, Create, and Shake a Fake Snake!

You Will Need:
Paper plate
Scissors (adult supervision)
Markers, crayons, or pencils (anything you have)
String (about 12" long)
Hole puncher (optional)

- 1. Draw a spiral on your plate with a black marker or pencil starting at the center and ending at the edge
- 2. Decorate your snake's body with a pattern or marking (like stripes or bands, dots, or whatever you choose)
- 3. Use your scissors to carefully cut on the spiral black line you drew.
- 4. The center of the spiral in the middle of the plate is your snake's head. Punch a hole near the head end. Add googly eyes or a tongue if you want and have the supplies!
- 5. Tie your string through the hole you punched. Your snake will move, or slither, as you dangle or wiggle the string!
