CAMP DAILY



Drop-Off & Pick-Up

All Camps are scheduled Monday-Friday from 9am-4pm.

Drop-off: 8:30-9:00am

Pick-up: 4:00-4:15pm.

Oxbow Meadows does not provide before or after care for summer camps. Oxbow Staff will be stationed at or near the parking area for drop off and pick up.

ID's will be checked at pick up. Ensure you have your ID with you. Only adults on approved list may pick up campers.

Campers must be signed in and out by parent or guardian at pick-up/drop-off area.

Daily Activities

Each Oxbow Camp features a wide variety of activities! Throughout your campers day they may explore Oxbow's trail system, encounter an animal ambassadors, learn a new wilderness skill, practice their scientific thinking, engage in teamwork with other campers, and expand their care for their natural world!

One thing is guaranteed: your camper will come home tired, happy, often wet, and sometimes muddy! Be prepared.

Car Talk!

Each day you student will leave with a paper with reminders for the next camp day and car talk questions. These questions are designed to help you engage with your student and what they learned that day!

CAMP POLICIES



Medications & First Aid



Staff members and campers are not permitted to keep medication in their personal belongings. If you need to take medication while you are at camp you will need to turn it in to the Program Director, we will collect them and return them at the end of the day. Campers must be able to self-administer meds.

Parents/guardians will be notified prior to any first aid treatment unless prior consent is given.



Pets & Other Animals

No pets or other living animals may be brought to summer camp. This policy does not apply to Service Animals.

Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking & Weapons

Alcohol and illegal drugs are not allowed on campus.

Oxbow Summer Camp is a smoke-free environment. Smoking and vaping are prohibited during camp and while on the Oxbow campus.

No weapons are permitted.

Staff may utilize tools such as pocket knives or hatchets for educational demonstrations.

Electronics Policies



Gaming devices, items that makes phone calls or accesses the internet are not permitted at camp.

Camp will not take responsibility for replacing electronic devices brought to camp, which may be damaged or lost. If any of the items not permitted are brought to camp, we will collect them and return them at the end of the day.

COME PREPARED

What to Wear



Campers are provided with an Oxbow Meadows T-Shirt. **Campers must wear an Oxbow Meadows shirt at all times during camp.** Additional shirts may be purchased at the Oxbow Meadows gift store.

Please send your camper with a complete change of clothes each day as we will encounter wet, muddy, and messy things during camp adventures. Non-Oxbow shirts are permitted as a change of clothes.

Closed toed-shoes are required.

Hats are recommended!

Sun Screen & Bug Spray



Make sure your student comes prepared with bug spray and sunscreen pre-applied each day.

Please send products labeled with the campers name for them to reapply at lunch time. Adventuring happens rain or shine! Dress for the weather. (Water-proof shoes or jacket)

Water Day!

Campers should bring a towel and change of clothes. Bathing suits may be worn underneath shirt and shorts only.

Food & Water

Bring: Two Snacks & Lunch

Please ensure your camper has enough food for the day. During designated camp hours we will pause for a morning and afternoon snack break, as well as for lunch.

Snacks and lunches are not provided by Oxbow Meadows, with the exception of food related camp activities.

We are a nut-free campus.

Food Allergies and dietary restrictions will be taken into consideration case by case.

A reusable water bottle will be provided on Monday to your camper. You are responsible for bringing a bottle daily to camp.

Water bottle refill locations will be available around camp.
